 - 3. Willingness to meet physical needs vs. 17, 18
 - a. Deuteronomy 15:7-11; Proverbs 11:24
- B. Assurances resulting from righteous living vs. 19-24
 - 1. That we are of the truth vs. 19, 20
 - a. Romans 8:16, 17; I John 5:13
 - 2. Answered Prayer vs. 21, 22
 - a. John 16:24; 1 John 5:14, 15
 - 3. That we abide in Him vs. 23, 24
 - a. If: We love the brethren and keep His commandments
 - 4. Please remember: All believers are secure, but all do not have assurance of their security.

III. Remember

- A. This is not a test to see if you are a child of God but rather a test of health.
 - 1. John includes himself. Note how he uses "we" over and over again. vs. 1:6, 7, 8, 9, 10
 - 2. He calls them "my little children" vs. 2:1, 28; 3:7

- B. A key word and favorite of John's is "abide". He uses it in the book of John 17 times and 26 times in I, II and III John. It means yield, trust, be at home with.
- C. Verse 3:9 is confusing to many. How can John in verse 1:10 say "if we say that we have not sinned we make Him a liar". (See also verse 1:8). Then say in verse 3:9 "he cannot sin, because he is born of God".
- D. Romans 6 and 7 explains this in detail. When I was born again (11-22-60) I received a new nature. Until I die I will have both an old nature and a new nature. My new nature never sins but my old nature does. I, Roger W. Blundel Jr., take and am responsible for all my old nature thinks, says and does. On the other hand, I cannot take credit for what my new nature produces.
