- A. Fact of God's Righteousness v. 29
 - "Like Father Like Son"
 - 1. He is righteous
 - 2. They who practice righteousness are born of Him
- B. Incentives for righteous living 3:1-3
 - 1. The love of God v. 1a
 - a. John 13:1; Romans 8:32; II Corinthians 5:14
 - 2. Our Sonship vs. 1b-2a
 - a. The privilege of it Romans 8:16, 17
 - b. The responsibility of it Ephesians 4:1
 - c. The result of it:
 - i. The world does not know us
 - ii. The world hates us John 15:18, 19
 - 3. The return of Christ 2: 28, 3:2b-3
 - a. Its nature
 - i. We shall see Him
 - ii. We shall be like Him Philippians 3:20, 21
 - b. Its effect: Purifying
 - i. Because you are dwelling on things above
 - Colossians 3:1-3; Hebrews 6:18
 - ii. Because you are prepared for His return
 - II Timothy 4:8
- C. Evidences of Righteous Living v. 3:4-12
 - 1. We do not practice sin vs. 4-10a (negatively) Because:
 - a. Sin is lawlessness: The absence of rules. v. 4
 - b. It violates the purpose for which He came v. 5
 - c. It violates His character v. 5b
 - d. It says we do not know Him vs. 6, 7
 - e. It says we are of the devil v. 8a
 - f. No one born of God sins habitually v. 9
 - g. It's a hallmark of a believer v. 10a

- 2. We bear fruit John 15:4-8 (Positively)
- 3. We love our brother vs. 10b-12
 - a. This is an old message with new meaning vs. 10b-11
 - i. See: 2:7, 8
 - b. Cain (a negative example) v. 12
 - i. He was of the evil one
 - ii. He hated Abel 's righteousness
 - c. Other examples:
 - i. Daniel: Daniel 6
 - ii. John the Baptist: Mark 6; 14—29
 - iii. Steven: Acts 7

III. Take Aways

- A. You will never interpret or understand God's correctlyclearly until you are clear on the following:
 - 1. Man (you and me) are both by nature and choice sinners
 - a. Psalm 51:5; Romans 3
 - 2. Man owes a debt he cannot pay by any means or any amount of time
 - a. Ephesians 2:8, 9
 - 3. The death and resurrection paid the debt we owe
 - a. Acts 3:13-16; Romans 4:22-25
 - 4. I appropriate that gift by faith and faith alone
 - a. Romans 4:5
 - 5. Works of any kind are to be viewed as a sign of gratitude
 - a. Colossians 2:6, 7
 - 6. Works are evidence of salvation before men only, not God
 - a. James 2:24
 - 7. Faithfulness to God's call of holy living benefits us now and latter
 - a. Matthew 25:21; Galatians 5:22, 23
